The Pentecost Offering is traditionally received on the day of Pentecost (May 27). It provides a direct way to meet the needs of children at risk, youth, and young adults. Congregations are encouraged to keep 40 percent of the offering to support ministries benefiting these age groups in their communities. Our contribution from First Presbyterian will go to One Way Farm.

The General Assembly's portion (60 percent) provides leadership development opportunities for Presbyterian youth and young adults and supports children-at-risk programs at the national level. Since 1998, Presbyterians of all ages have raised more than \$8 million for these ministries that benefit younger members of God's family.

I know it's hard to believe, but I have heard that a few (but only a *very few*) of you I have occasionally (but only very

occasionally) gotten behind in your Bible reading. On the other hand, I have also heard comments like, "I was actually reading my Bible most days we were in Florida—first time I have ever done that!"

Since Leviticus, Numbers, and Deuteronomy are as exciting as any suspense novel, it's hard to imagine how anyone could be behind. But just in case you are, what to do? If you are *really* behind, the best thing to do is jump ahead and pick up the reading for the current day again. That way you will be reading along with the rest of our Year of the Bible readers, and sermons and Bible study will be more meaningful. Then, each day, try to go back and add some of the material you've missed. You will be surprised how quickly you can get caught up again.

If you have questions about the readings, ask me. I try to comment on some of the reading in sermons and Bible study, but at the rate we are going I can't look at everything. So ask. I love to talk about the Bible.

SESSION NOTES

Your session met for their regular meeting on April 19. Pat Hathaway led the opening devotions on the theme of "blessings."

This was session's special meeting of the year at which the new officers elected at the January Annual Meeting were examined for office. Elder-elect Kieron Boyle and Deacons-elect Amber Boyle, Gregg Clark, Isabella Develen, Sue Griffey, Judy Karchner, Katherine Oellerich, Lynne Wiley, and Lisa Wilson each made their statements of faith. It is always a very moving experience to hear our new officers speak of their faith and their hopes for service to our church. New officers will be ordained and installed at the April 29 worship service.

Session then approved minutes for the March 15 meeting, the clerk's report, and the consent agenda, which included the date of the Rummage Sale, June 2, with the proceeds to go to the FISH Fund and the Kirkmont Campership Fund; and a joint meeting of session and the Board of Trustees in June.

Darrell Templeton presented a report from the Christian Education Committee, which included information on the Presbyterian Youth Connection Retreat at Kirkmont Center in April, to which we will send six youth and two adults; and on Vacation Bible School, which is scheduled for Sunday, July 29, through Thursday, August 2, 5:45-8:30 p.m. The theme for this year's VBS is "Operation Overboard—Dare to Go Deep with God!" Dianne Gerber and Ann Veith are the co-directors. There was also discussion of the Sunday School program.

Pat Hathaway reported for the Member Development Committee on Gals Gathering at the Garden and Euchre Night, as well as progress on the pictorial directory. Bill Trick made a plea for two gas grills and for volunteers to help with the Party on the Lawn on June 27.

Marge Wooley reported that the Mission Committee made a \$2,000 contribution to the Mt. Pleasant Life Care Fund, and a \$1,000 contribution to Hope House.

Marty Hensler reported for the Administration and Personnel Committee that progress is being made on revisions to the Personnel Policies Manual and the child protection policies.

Kathy Harris reported for the Trustees that income for March was \$19,098 and expenditures were \$26,992 for a monthly shortfall of \$7,894. Year-to-date the operating budget is running a surplus of \$39,394. The Trustees presented two items to be financed by the Contingency Support Fund--\$1,106 for termite control on the east side of the building, and up to \$15,000 to repave the east parking lot and make repairs to the Circle Drive and west parking lots. Both items were approved.

Mike Jenkins and Nancy Peterson were elected commissioners to the May 8 meeting of Miami Valley Presbytery.

A proposal to reduce the number of deacons in each class from 10 to 8, which has been under discussion by both the session and the deacons for some time, was approved.

The meeting was adjourned with a blessing from the Dead Sea Scrolls. During the meeting, as is our practice, the Session paused to read sections from the Declaration of Faith, to voice prayer concerns, and for prayer.

Dear family in Christ at FPC,

Greetings from Izmir! Thank you very, very much for your generous gift of \$3500 for our work here in Izmir, Turkey. And thanks for your prayers for us and those around us here. A nurse who has been coming to Bible Study for several months is looking forward to being baptized soon. Over the past few months, many students have attended as well, and some are now going to one of the local Turkish churches. God is very gracious. Some of the students are able to speak openly with their families about their interest in Christ and the Bible, but most are quiet until a year or two after being baptized.

Dianne organized a bocce tournament and they had a blast today about a mile from here (at a covered tennis court) – physically disabled and mentally challenged – all had lots of fun and trophies were awarded to all. Fun!

Last week I was one of the teachers at a CPR course. Several of my former residents were there. They are now chairmen of their departments at big university and government hospitals. They're doing a great job training the younger generation. I'm trying to get them involved in multi-center research projects with other from overseas.

Please keep praying that the Lord would work in the hearts of the four doctors I work with closely. Dianne and I had long talks with one, who last month had a renewal-of-their-wedding-vows ceremony after being separated for several months. I was glad to be one of the witnesses to sign the ledger book for them.

The past few weeks have been busy caring for other "workers" here: rashes, abdominal pains, lacerations, fevers, sore throats, palpitations. Dianne is helping organize a wheelchair tennis tournament in Antalya next week. I'll go with her and also teach for a day at the big government hospital there. The emergency doctors want me to help them learn to use their bedside ultrasound machine more effectively. These sessions will be good for me too, as I'll learn a lot in my preparation for six hours of teaching!

Dianne's skills are much used as she serves as one of the church wardens. She helps keep the church open to be used by other evangelical churches for services, weddings, etc. It was a real blessing to be at the wedding of a young Christian couple a few weeks ago. Standing room only. God is great!

Thank you again for your prayers and for your generous gift.

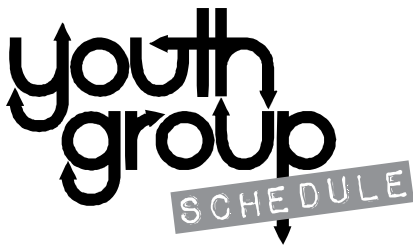
